



Thanksgiving Food Drive

Litchfield Social Services is running a food drive for their Thanksgiving Baskets. Fresh produce such as butter, rolls,

potatoes, sweet potatoes, beets, squash, carrots, green beans, brussels sprouts, onion, celery, fresh herbs and turnips, ect, can be dropped off at St. Anthony's on the weekend of November 15/16, or Monday the 17th before 9am.

 ${f A}$ rchbishop Christopher J. Coyne is fulfilling his promise on May 1, 2024 - his first day in office - to bring Catholic education back to the city of Hartford after a ten-year absence.

The city of Hartford has not had a Catholic school operating within its borders since St. Augustine School closed at the end of the 2015-2016 school year.

To end that drought, Archbishop Coyne announced during a press conference on Oct. 9 that the Archdiocese of Hartford has purchased a building on Asylum Avenue in Hartford, which it plans to open next fall as the Catholic Academy of Hartford.

"I simply could not accept that our state capital, and the geographic and spiritual center of our archdiocese, did not have a school to form our young people," Archbishop Coyne said.

For its opening year, the Catholic Academy of Hartford will initially welcome Hartford students in pre-kindergarten through the second grade. The longer-term plan for the new school is to add one grade each year, expanding up to the eighth grade.

"Within the walls you see behind me, future leaders and contributors will be formed - mind, body and spirit. With a quality, affordable education, their potential will prove limitless," the archbishop said.

CATHOLIC EDUCATION RETURNS TO HARTFORD

Catholic Academy of Hartford to open in fall of 2026.

The sale of the property, a former three-story office building at 765 Asylum Ave., was completed in September. The building is located behind the Cathedral of St. Joseph.

With the goal of beginning classes in the fall of 2026, the Archdiocese of Hartford plans to renovate the property, creating classrooms on the upper floors and a multi-purpose room in the basement. New exterior signage and a cross have already been erected.

"The opening of this school is representative of renewal, revival and a great reversal of the downward trends we experienced before and during COVID," Archbishop Coyne noted.

"Mass attendance is up, the number of men and women discerning vocations to the priesthood and religious life is up, and most important to today's announcement, Catholic school enrollment is up," he reported. In fact, the archbishop said, most archdiocesan schools have waiting lists.

"With the wind in our sails," Archbishop Coyne said, "the timing was right for the Archdiocese of Hartford to make a generational contribution to the city of Hartford for the education of its children." During the press conference, Valerie Mara, superintendent of Catholic schools for the archdiocese, reiterated the archbishop's commitment to restoring Catholic education in Hartford through a "just tuition model" in which Hartford families would pay on a sliding scale, according to their ability to pay.

The hope is to extend the opportunity for a Catholic education to all families in the city at all income levels.

The school intends to serve Hartford residents first, Mara noted, regardless of their faith tradition or creed. "Our doors are open to any family that wants a Catholic education," she

Development initiatives and fundraising events for the Catholic Academy of Hartford are now underway. "I welcome with open arms civic leaders, benefactors and changemakers of any stripe who wish to be a part of this exciting endeavor," Archbishop Coyne said.

Branches on the Vine

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

My friends, over the past few weeks we have been talking about prayer. We have described it as the mode or vehicle of our communication with God where we present to Him all of our desires, needs, and wants. For many of us, as stated before, we pray often when we need something or when tragedy strikes. However, we need to, as St. Paul said last week in his letter to Timothy, 'pray without becoming weary.' Prayer is not meant to be something that should be seen as a chore or a tool. Rather an opportunity for us to intimately unite ourselves to God in order for us to ask Him for all that He already knows we need, but even more importantly to listen to him. Prayer is more than just us talking to God. It is actually meant for us to listen to him.

One of the initiatives we have taken here at our Parish is continuing Eucharistic Adoration. Adoration and Confession. held on Monday's, gives people the opportunity to come before the Eucharistic Lord, who is actively present, and just to be with Him. That's all that He wants. Very simple. We think that Prayer needs to be formal, but it really isn't. Adoration helps us to put aside that 'formality' and allow for Jesus to be present to us as we try to be present to Him. Eucharistic Adoration is a tradition in the Church that gives the faithful the opportunity to kneel, sit, stand before our Lord in His actual presence and form in our own human minds. When the Eucharist is consecrated at Mass it no longer is bread and wine, although the elements that make it up still are the same, the very form and substance is transformed into His Body and Blood. So when we go before the Lord, we express our love for Him, and also our belief in His actual presence in the Eucharist- the source and summit of our Faith.

Over the course of time there have been miracles that have been attributed to the Eucharist. St. Carlo Acutis would often study them and he actually made a website for us to learn more about these miracles. Some of them portray the blood of Christ (scientifically proven) being poured out from the Eucharist. Others present us with different healing miracles. Others, natural miracles; and so much more. But the one thing we need to realize that in going to Eucharistic Adoration, we need to not put up barriers- meaning that we should not prevent ourselves from giving to God what is due to Him, in a sense- and that is us. When we read the Gospel for today, the rich Pharisee boasts of all that he gave the Lord and refuses to look at himself as a human person- a sinner. While the tax collector cannot even look up toward the divine presence in the temple and truly sees within himself his sins, wounds, and his entire humanity. He avails himself so much to God that he asks for mercy from Him. This is what we need to do my friends. In coming to Adoration, we should avail ourselves to God-mind, body, heart, and spirit. If God sees it all anyways, why do we try to hide it. He is the only one that can heal us, so why not let him.

May our prayer be like the tax collector when we go before the Lord in Adoration. An opportunity for us to present ourselves, with our own recognition, of our weakness as human persons; but an opportunity for Christ to heal us as He wounds. "O God, be merciful to me a sinner."
