

Saint ANTHONY ABBOT

Following the death of his parents when he was about 20, Anthony insured that his sister completed her education, then he sold his house, furniture, and the land he owned, gave the proceeds to the poor, joined the anchorites who lived nearby, and moved into an empty sepulchre. At age 35 he moved to the desert to live alone; he lived 20 years in an abandoned fort. Anthony barricaded the place for solitude, but admirers and would-be students broke in. He miraculously healed people, and agreed to be the spiritual counselor of others. His recommendation was to base life on the Gospel. Word spread, and so many disciples arrived that Anthony founded two monasteries on the Nile, one at

Pispir, one at Arsinoc. Many of those who lived near him supported themselves by making baskets and brushes, and from that came his patronage of those trades. Anthony briefly left his seclusion in 311, going to Alexandria, Egypt to fight Arianism, and to comfort the victims of the persecutions of Maximinus. At some point in his life, he met with his sister again. She, too, had withdrawn from the world, and directed a community of nuns. Anthony retired to the desert, living in a cave on Mount Colzim, where he died in 356 AD.

COME, PRAY THE ROSARY ONLINE

St. John Fisher Parish invites the homebound to join in.

Five years ago during the height of the coronavirus, Deacon John McKaig of St. John Fisher Parish in Marlborough was invited to join two parishioners to pray the rosary on a Zoom call.

"I was going through chemo at the time, and my wife Patty and I started joining them the following Monday," he recalls. "Nine months later, my cancer was in remission."

Every Monday at 8:30 a.m., the prayer community begun by Jennifer O'Neill and Kurt Filosa gathers online to pray the Scriptural rosary, and that half hour has been a source of solace for people who often can't leave home.

"The big advantage," says Gil Thompson, who hosts the prayer session, "is that if someone is too sick to come to church, they can sit at home with their laptop and pray with us. Some, who have cancer, can turn on their video and not worry about transportation. We could be anywhere in the world and pray together."

His wife Laurie recalls a member of the church who suffered from Lou Gehrig's Disease and was committed to praying with them.

"When he first joined us, you could see the impact it had on him," she says. "He asked to do the responses, and tears would be flowing from his eyes."

The community of 10 people was so committed they would often go to his home to get him up.

"He needed us and we needed him," Laurie says. "It got to the point where he could no longer speak, but two weeks before he passed, his caregiver brought him on." The group prays for many intentions, including those who are sick, new babies, job seekers, graduates and people who have overcome illnesses.

"We pray for everything," Gil says, "including our pastor, Father George Mukuka." Word of the online rosary ministry spread and parishioners often reach out with intentions.

"It's fulfilling to pray for people," Laurie says. "Parishioners who are ill are happy when they hear they're in our prayers. And whether they're here or not, they know we're praying for them."

"We're starting our week with prayer and thinking about people who are less fortunate because of health issues or whatever," Gil says, "And we think about them for the rest of the week"

During the rosary, Gil reads the Scriptural verse for each Hail Mary, while Laurie prays the response and others recite it at home.

"This method of praying the rosary keeps my mind focused on the Scripture reflections that the leader reads before each Hail Mary," Deacon McKaig says. "The beauty of the rosary, he says, is that it offers Catholics a way to meditate on the life of Jesus and the Blessed Mother, starting with the Annunciation when Mary said "yes" to God's invitation, and culminating in Jesus' Ascension and her Assumption.

"When we join others in this spiritual practice, it's a powerful way to live out our baptismal promises by living the Greatest Commandment to love the Lord our God with all our heart, soul and mind and the Second Commandment, which is like it, to love our neighbor as ourselves," Deacon McKaig says. "This lets us always remember it's not about me. It's not about you. It's all about what we can do for someone else."

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Today's page from the Gospel emphasizes that, when Jesus had received baptism from John in the River Jordan, "the heavens were opened" to him (Mt 3:16). This fulfils the prophecies. In fact, there is an invocation which the liturgy has us repeat during the Season of Advent: "O that thou wouldst rend the heavens and come down" (Is 64:1). If the heavens remain closed, our horizon in this earthly life is dark and without hope. Instead, in celebrating Christmas, once again faith has given us the certainty that the heavens have been rent with the coming of Christ. And on the day of the baptism of Christ we continue to contemplate the heavens opened. The manifestation of the Son of God on earth marks the beginning of the great time of mercy, after sin had closed the heavens, raising itself as a barrier between the human being and his Creator. With the birth of Jesus the heavens open! God gives us in Christ the guarantee of an indestructible love. From the moment the Word became flesh it is therefore possible to see the open heavens. It was possible for the shepherds of Bethlehem, for the Magi of the East, for the Baptist, for Jesus' Apostles, and for St Stephen, the first martyr, who exclaimed: "Behold, I see the heavens opened!" (Acts 7:56). And it is possible for each one of us, if we allow ourselves to be suffused with God's love, which is given to us for the first time in Baptism by means of the Holy Spirit. Let us allow ourselves to be invaded by God's love! This is the great time of mercy! Do not forget it: this is the great time of Mercy!

When Jesus received the baptism of repentance from John the Baptist, showing solidarity with the repentant people - He without sin and with no need for conversion - God the Father made his voice heard from heaven: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased"

(v. 17). Jesus receives approval from the heavenly Father, who sent him precisely that he might accept to share our condition, our poverty. Sharing is the true way to love.

Jesus does not dissociate himself from us, he considers us brothers and sisters and he shares with us. And so he makes us sons and daughters, together with him, of God the Father. This is the revelation and source of true love. And this is the great time of mercy!

Does it not seem to you that in our own time extra fraternal sharing and love is needed? Does it not seem to you that we all need extra charity? Not the sort that is content with extemporaneous help which does not involve or stake anything, but that charity that shares, that takes on the hardship and suffering of a brother. What flavour life acquires when we allow ourselves to be inundated by God's love!

Let us ask the Holy Virgin to support us by her intercession in our commitment to follow Christ on the way of faith and charity, the path traced out by our Baptism.
